NEW ANTI-DOPING REGULATIONS

(15/11/2005)

Following the FIA's harmonisation of anti-doping procedures, through the adoption of the World Anti-Doping Code, there are important changes for 2009 if you are taking medication.

If you are competing in International events, events outside the UK or in the British Rally Championship, British GT Championship, British F3 Championship or the British Touring Car Championship and are taking any prescribed or over-the-counter medication which contains prohibited substances or is administered by a prohibited method, you will be required to apply for the new Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). Please refer to the new Regulations 2.8. of the enclosed 2009 Licence Notes.

Those competitors who fall within those events as detailed above, currently running under previous approval for their medication, must apply for the TUE on an annual basis.

For other competitors in National 'A', National 'B' or Clubman status events within the UK, the current approval system remains unchanged.

For those competitors who require a TUE who are competing in any FIA Championship, their TUE application must be forwarded to the FIA, by the MSA, at least 45 days before their first event. You must therefore submit your TUE application a minimum of 50 working days before your first event to the Licence Department at the MSA, clearly marked with the FIA Championship Title.
